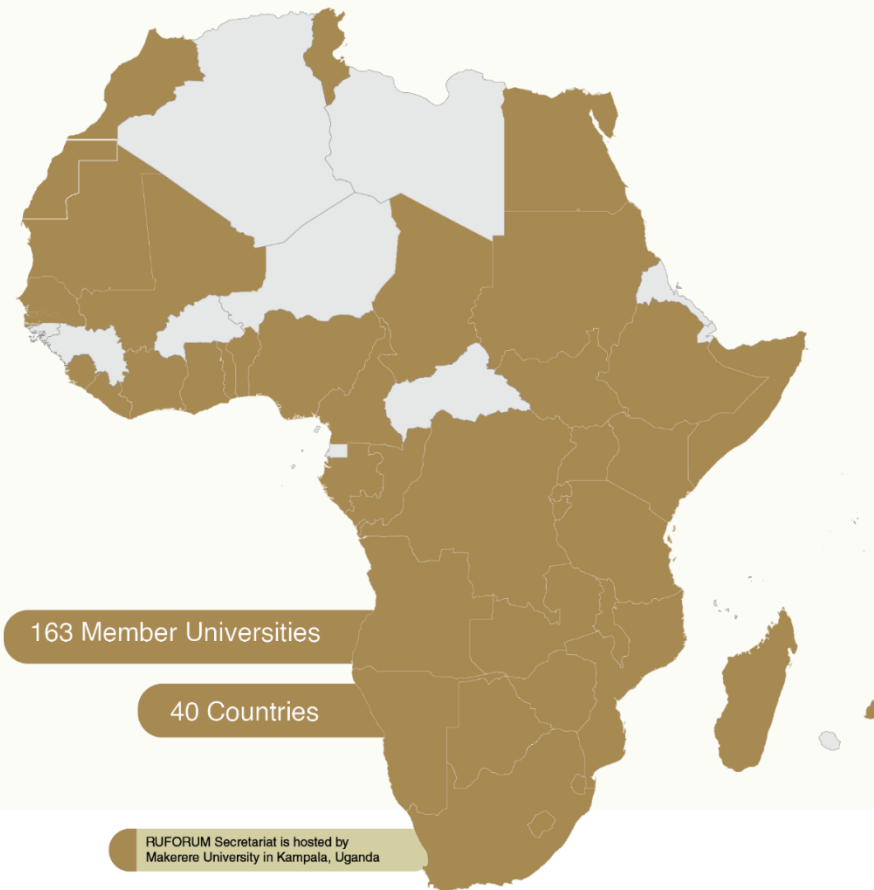

## OUR VISION

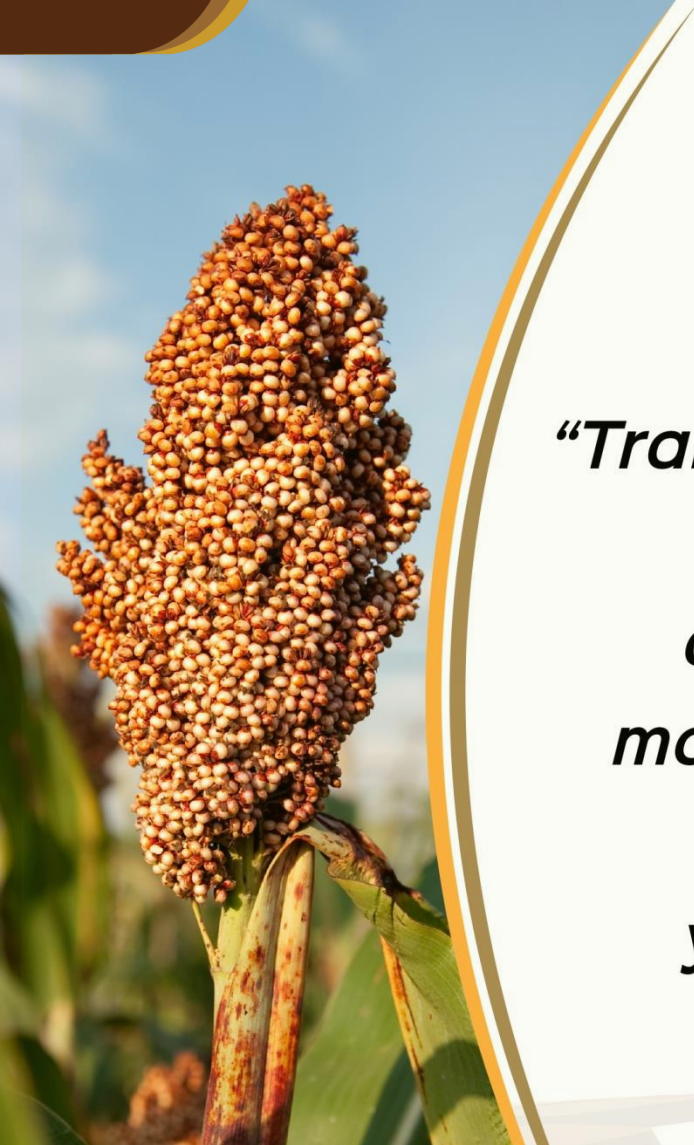
A vibrant, transformative universities catalyzing sustainable, inclusive agricultural development to feed and create prosperity for Africa.



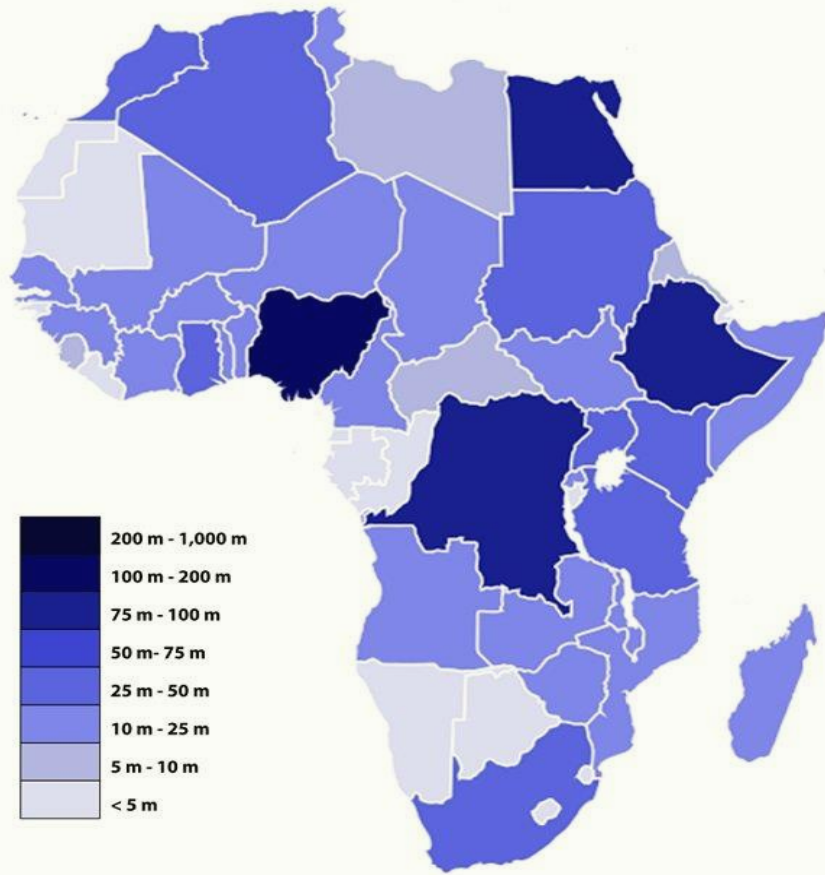
# OUR MOTIVATION

# 2024 Population Challenges (dividend or Curse)



- Social exclusion and marginalization
- Cultural diversity and inequity
- Food insecurity ( Changing tastes and diets/ increased food prices)
- Increasing youth **unemployment**
- **Innovation** catch up with the rest of the world
- Human Capacity (technical skills & attitude)
- Marketisation ( **Frugal Innovation**)



# Characteristic of Agric in Africa



- Highly diverse **land tenure** system
- **Small holding** more than 90% of farms in Africa are less than five hectares in size with Increasing **fragmentation**.
- **Land degradation**- Poor soils, reduced fallows, and nutrient mining.
- Low levels of **energy access**, particularly
- Increasing **urbanization** with reduced productivity capacity
- **70% of** the population is employed in agricultural related sectors
- The agricultural sector contributes up to **30% GDP**

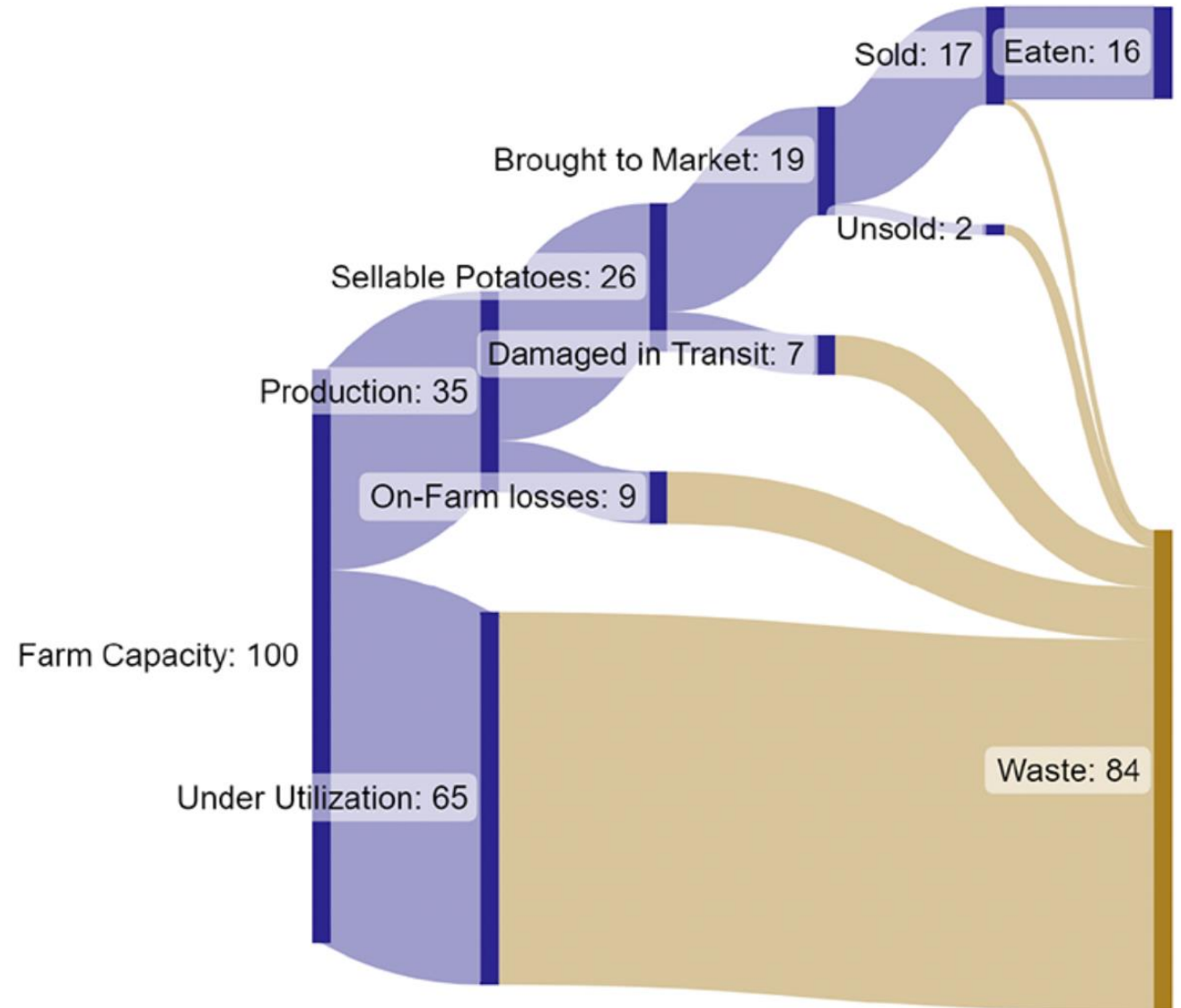
## Capacity challenges

# Capacity Challenges- Endemic?

## Capacity across the Value chain – The Food loss and waste conundrum

- 30%–70%
- Government agriculture extension has fallen



## Implications for development

- Increasing **food prices**, and food insecurity
- Increasing **youth unemployment**,
- High and persistent levels of **extreme poverty**, with significantly higher levels in rural areas.
- Low levels of **economic growth** and high levels of inequality in access to key productive assets
- Create scenarios and policies for engagement and development

# What are the plug ins?

## **Design programs that:**

- Create meaningful and equitable partnership that will address the key challenges
- Develop capacity for technical solutions that focus on addressing the fundamental challenges to improve livelihoods especially (youth)
- Facilitate capacity for the appropriate enabling environment across the value chain (finance, markets, policy and regulation)
- Increased awareness/modelling for technical/ financial / skills needs to address climate, food security solutions.
